# director's message

It's hard to believe but less than two months from now we will have finished our Western National Meet that runs from October 8 to 12 at the Irvine Marriott with the show field at William Mason Regional Park. Things are really heating up. We have mailed out 45 packets and distributed 50 at various events and have received a lot of registrations that are coming from the Web site. Already 15 people have mailed in their checks and registration information. So far we have approximately 24 cars registered. Many people are bringing multiple cars.

When making reservations at the Marriott please be sure to call them at 1-866-440-3373 and mention that you are with the Lincoln Continental Owners Club and use Code #LCOH.

Sunday, July 20, we had our summer picnic at Mason Park and spent some time reviewing the show field layout (see attached article on the event) and enjoying the beauty of the park. We can hold up to 120 cars in the designated area for parking on the grass.

Janet and I spent three days from June 27 to 29 at the Art Astor Auction and watched 300 cars being auctioned off plus lots of memorabilia items. The total take was \$14.5 million and included 7 Lincolns, 1 Edsel, 37 Fords, and 7 Mercurys. The highlights of the Lincolns was the Rita Hayworth 1941 Lincoln Continental Coupe which went for \$209,000, a 1933 Lincoln KA Dietrich Convertible Coupe that sold for \$143,000, a 1938 Lincoln-Zephyr convertible sedan that went for \$140,250, a 1936 Lincoln Model K dual windshield convertible sedan by LeBaron at \$132,000, a 1941 Lincoln Continental Cabriolet at \$63,250, a 1937 Lincoln Zephyr four door sedan at \$45,100, and a 1956 Mark II at \$38,500. We really wanted to buy a car but the prices: well you can see from the numbers above why we didn't.

Art Astor has kept 80 of his best cars, radios, and other memorabilia (ones that he couldn't give up) and will continue to have the show room which we will be visiting at the meet on Friday, October 10. I think this is the last opportunity to view his collection and it still is one of the largest in Southern California.

We look forward to seeing you soon.





# 2008 Western National Meet, Duluth, Minnesota June 25-29

The Mid-America National Meet was held in Duluth, Minnesota, June 25-29 and was sponsored by the North Star Region. The weather was excellent except for brief showers Friday. The number of cars entered was disappointing, 70 as opposed to over 100 cars anticipated. The low turnout was attribued to a combination of high gas prices and the Duluth location. Most of the cars came from Minnesota and the immediately surrounding states and Canada.

There was an excellent variety of cars from all eras and the quality of all the cars entered was extremely high.

One of the main features of the

meet was the first driving tour in 50 years. Thursday some 30 cars drove from Duluth to Bayfield, Wisconsin, a distance of 80 miles. The group had lunch at the Wild Rice Restaurant, a five star restaurant that was open that day exclusively for LCOC.

The show Saturday inside at the (DECC) Duluth Entertainment and Convention Center, was a first as an indoor meet. Many members commented favorably on the large, well lighted indoor location.

The winner of the Elliston Bell Founder's Trophy Saturday night was Jerry Seibert's 1970 Continental Mark III from Illinois. All in all, it was an excellent meet and Duluth is a far better meet site than it is credited as being.




