At the Winter Board of Directors Meeting of LCOC January 23 in Orlando, Florida the funding program for the Lincoln Foundation Museum was announced with Joanne Lower as the Lincoln Continental Owners Club Funding Coordinator. The Lincoln Motor Car Museum will be built on the Gilmore Car Museum's grounds at Hickory Corners, Michigan. Many members of the Lincoln clubs have been working for years to bring this idea to a reality.

In order to jump start the effort, Jerry Capizzi and Chris Dunn have graciously presented us with \$300,000 in challenge grants. The challenge grants stipulate that club members must match their \$300,000 offer by August 1, 2010. Already more than 33% of the required matching funds have been pledged.

The Lincoln Museum will be 20,000 square feet built in two phases. The Foundation will own the building and the collections. The Gilmore will own the land and maintain the collection and the building. The Gilmore Museum is located on a 90 acre site midway between Chicago and Detroit. In addition to the Gilmore Museum's own buildings and 250 cars, there are Museums for the Classic Car Club of America, the Pierce Arrow Society, and soon to come the H.H. Franklin Car Club.

The time has come for all Western Region members to step up to the plate. The gifts can be made in your name, in commemoration of someone you wish to honor, or as a memorial to a loved one or friend. Appropriate recognition of your gift will be made at the museum site.

Many special naming opportunities are available, or one that particularly appeals to you can be created. You can pledge \$100 for a Walkway Brick or \$25,000 for a Patio or Exhibit or any amount in between. Perhaps there are people in the region that would want to pledge \$50,000 for a gallery in their name. The region might want to combine their contribution and do a Garden or Patio in the name of the Region. All pledges can be payable over five years and are totally tax deductible. A pledge card is included on page 6 of this issue of the *Confab*.

Bruce and Helen Hutchinson have ioined Den and Jan Fenske to co-host the Meet and help with planning meetings, plaques, and raffle basket coordination. Marv Wendt and Jan McNiel are serving as Meet registrars, and are handling all of the reservations for both club members and cars. Regional Director Norm Hoskins and his wife Nancy are managing meet packet and "goodie bag" distribu-

tion, while name tags are being created by Mike and Janet Gribble. Carol Reniger is serving as auction promoter and, with the help of her husband, Hal, has been busy soliciting donations, raffle prizes, car items, and contents for the "goodie bags". Our other major fund raising element of the meet, raffle ticket sales, will be coordinated by our "in house raffle pros" Karen and Larry Frazier. National Board Meeting, Orlando, Florida, January 23

The 2010 Winter Board Meeting of the Lincoln and Continental Owners Club was held January 23 at the Airport Holiday Inn in Orlando, Florida. The bad news is declining membership which has been continuing for several years and saw a loss of 193 members in 2009. The good news is that a \$15,000 loss to the club in 2008 was stemmed in 2009 primarily by cost trimming measures in publications and trophies without noticable differences to the membership. The Reno meet sponsored by National made a \$6,000 profit. Charlie Blais saved the club several thousand dollars by volunteering to move club projects, including back issues of Comments, from Illinois to Massachusetts.

All 2010 and 2011 National Meets and two of the three 2012 National Meets are now in place. Regions putting on National Meets will be given \$500 in seed money. E-mail will now be the official correspondence of LCOC Officers and Directors. The Lincoln Foundation Museum Funding Program was discussed in great detail and is presented to members on the first page of this issue of the Confab. Two Director's seats will be available for 2010 elections. John Malta has resigned as head of Judging Standards due to health and has been replaced by Steve D'Ambrosia. Several changes in Judging Standards will be covered in Lincoln and Continental Comments. The next Winter Board Meeting will be held in late January, 2011 in New Orleans.

Exhibition Class

The entry fee for cars in the Exhibition Class at LCOC National Meets has been reduced from \$35 to \$20 which should make it more attractive to exhibit Lincolns at the Western National Meet in Ventura in May. \$10 of this fee now goes to the region. All Lincolns and Continentals 10 years old and older are eligible for this class where they are put on the field for display but are not judged.
