John Rutenberg's 1980 Bill Blass Mark VI

John Rutenberg, Palm Springs, California, entered a 1980 Mark VI Bill Blass at the Early Ford V-8 Picnic in Anaheim in September. He bought the car in Biloxi, Mississippi, finding it through the Old Car Trader. The car looks brand new and has only 45,000 There are probably only 10 miles. 1980 Bill Blass Marks left and John had been looking for one for 10 years. He guesses that there were only about 200 made originally. He has had this car for less than two years. He has only had to replace the aftermarket exhaust system and the original tires with new steel belted radials.

He believeves that this car is the finest 1980 Bill Blass Mark VI in existence. It is certainly the finest example of a 1980 model ever shown at a LCOC event.

1976 was the last year of the Continental Mark IV and the first year of the Designer Series which included the Bill Blass, Cartier, Givenchy, and Pucci. Three of the rare 1976 Bill Blass models were entered the 2010 Mid-America National Meet in Lincoln, Nebraska.

The 1976 Bill Blass had a metallic blue body with a cream Normande grain half vinyl roof, cream and gold paint/tape stripes, and either cream or dark blue body side moldings. Twin comfort seats were either blue majestic cloth or blue leather with cream accent straps and buttons. The Bill Blass script was carried in the oval opera windows. If you can imagine it, the Bill Blass was a \$1,500 to \$2,000 option on a car that already cost over \$10,000.

The 1977 Mark V was a complete redesign on the same 120.4 inch wheelbase as the Mark IV but weighed 400 pounds less. This year the Bill Blass had midnight blue paint and a chamois colored Landau vinyl roof with a full vinyl roof optional. The leather or velour interior matched the roof in color. Body side moldings were chamois or midnight blue. There were dual chamois paint stripes on the body sides and decklid and there were Bill Blass insignas on the front fenders. Once again the Bill Blass signature appeared in the opera windows.

The 1978 Bill Blass Mark V was offered in Midnight Cordovan with a Valino grain deep padded Landau roof in light champagne. The model was also available with a full vinyl roof. The light champagne was carried on the body side moldings and in the **(Continued on Page 4)**

dual pinstripes. The interior was either cordovan ultra velour cloth or cordovan vinyl and leather.

The 1979 Bill Blass had the most unique paint scheme of the Mark V series. The hood, decklid, and upper sides were white. The lower body sides and decklid contour were in midnight blue. The carriage roof was white with a bright dicast rear pillar ornament. If the optional full vinyl roof was ordered the Bill Blass name was in the opera windows. The interior was either white leather with midnight blue accents or all midnight blue. Thee were dark blue side moldings and dual gold paint stripes on the body sides and decklid. There were color keved cast aluminum wheels. The 1979 Bill Blass carried a nautical theme which was the Bill Blass theme of the time. Small anchors were incorporated into the exterior accent striping and interior accents within the Bill Blass Back to Back "B" design theme.

The 1980 Mark VI. John Rutenberg's car, was the first downsized Mark. In the Bill Blass the color scheme was very similar to 1979 but the car was all new. The carriage roof was white, the hood and top of the decklid were white, the body sides and decklid contour were dark blue. The interior was either all white, as is Rutenberg's car, or all blue. This was the last year of the white and blue nautical theme.

The 1981 Bill Blass Mark VI had dark blue metallic uppers with body sides in light fawn metallic. 1982 brought extreme color change. For the first time there were three Bill Blass color combinations. First, there was a white carriage roof and white uppers with a red midsection and white lowers. Then, there was a diamond grain white carriage roof over a stark white body. Finally, there was a black carriage roof, black uppers and lowers, and a red midsection. Brad Luse in New York State has one of these rare Bill Blass models. 1983 brought more color changes. There were either black uppers and lowers with french vanilla body sides or french vanilla



uppers and lowers with black body sides. The late Doug Mattix had one of these cars with the french vanilla body sides.

1984 brought an all new and even more downsized Mark VII with extreme aerodynamics and air suspension. Now only the Bill Blass remained with the Versace added in the Mark series. The 1984 Bill Blass was painted Goldenrod Glamour and Harvest Wheat with cream and dark green stripes. The interior was gold and there were Bill Blass touches all over the car. Ed Harants in Ohio has owned a 1984 Bill Blass Mark VII since new. Bill Schmidt in Florida has a 1984 Bill Blass with a diesel engine which he has owned since new.

The 1985 Bill Blass Mark VII came in Silver Sand and Burnshed Pewter. We do not have information on the color scheme on the 1986 or 1987 models. The 1988 Bill Blass Mark VII was painted light metallic blue with a dark blue interior. One of these still in the hands of the original owner was entered at the 2009 Eastern National Meet in Lancaster, Pennsylania. Tim Howley also owns a 1988 Bill Blass Mark VII which he bought several years ago in Oakland. A 1989 Bill Blass Mark VII was entered by Gordon Taylor at the 2011 Eastern National Meet in Laconia, New York. This car is a wine red with a gray interior. The Bill Blass was continued the end of the Mark VII series but we have no information on color schemes.

Get Ready For the Getty Villa!

Our trip to the Getty Villa in Malibu is scheduled for March 24. We'll meet there at 10:30 am, and have lunch around 11:30 or 12:00.

The Getty Villa is modeled after a first-century Roman country house, the Villa dei Papiri in Herculaneum, Italy. It houses the J. Paul Getty Museum's collection of approximately 44,000 Greek, Roman, and Etruscan antiquities. Over 1,200 works are on view in 23 galleries devoted to the permanent collection,

with five additional galleries for changing exhibitions. With objects dating from 6,500 B.C. to A.D. 400, the collection contains monumental sculptures as well as artifacts of everyday life.

Gardens are integral to the setting of the Getty Villa, as they were in the ancient Roman home. Open spaces around the site feature bronze sculptures, fountains, and lush plantings of trees, herbs, and flowers used by the Romans.

Renovation of the Villa began in 2000 and was completed in 2006 at a cost of 275 million dollars.

So if you haven't been in a while you're in for a real treat.

Entry to the museum is free, but parking is \$15. Lunch will be around \$10-\$15.

November, 2011 Region Board Meeting Highlights

The Fall, 2011 Board Meeting was held Saturday Nobember 12 at the Flamingo Hotel in Santa Rosa, California. Ten Officers and Board members were in attendance.

Under Membership, Mike Cunningham reported that with a loss of six members there are now 222 members in the Western Region. The renewal process involves sending an email to those who receive *Confab* electronically. After two emails, a hard copy is sent that includes a Lincoln Foundation pamphlet. Those who receive *Confab* by mail receive the renewal notices by mail.

On the National LCOC front, Bruce Hutchinson reports that the next National LCOC Bsoard Meeting will be in Orlando, Florida January 26-28.

Region Director Marv Wendt reported that monthly club expenses are approximately \$550 with most of this going to produce and distribute the *Confab.*- The Morro Bay Meet costs were \$795.23 (\$25 per attendee). Payment for awards, dash plaques, and the hospitality suite were included in this figure. This expense is well worth the exposure of the club to potential new members. Membership and event packets were sent to all National LCOC members in California who are not Western Region members and to Nevada members of LCOC-National now that Nevada is part of the Western Region. This effort cost of \$282.77, but the procurement of at least 10 new members to offset this cost.

The start-up cost for the club's new window flag project and a potential camp shirt project will be between \$300 and \$400. To date, the club has received \$270 from flag sales, and now that the project marketing has started, the region has the

potential to earn up to \$1,000 from the initial production run of 100 flags. An ad will appear in one *Comments* issue per year and on the National and Western Region websites.

The board discussed ways to recognize club members who have passed away. The idea of a \$100 brick at the new Lincoln museum was favorably received, although the criteria and process for making this happen still needs to be developed. Bruce Hutchinson will check with National to see what is being done in other regions before we finalize our process.

Dennis and Sandra Kay were asked to report on the five car clubs with which they participate to help us get a sense of strengths and opportunities that our club offers. The board discussed working more closely with other Lincoln clubs, such as the Zephyr and the LS clubs, and with other clubs, such as the Cadillac-LaSalle Club. Marv will do some follow-up on this.

Problems with overly strict car judging at the last Western Regional Meet were discussed, and the board unanimously authorized Bruce Hutchinson to bring this subject up for discussion at the next National Board Meeting.

The Western National Meet will be held in in Concord, California September 26-30, 2012. The Concord Hilton is confirmed as the meet site with \$99 room rates. A driving tour to the famous Blackhawk Collection is planned, and proximity to the sites of San Francisco and the Napa Valley wine region will give attendees great opportunities for getting



away for fun and adventure during the week of the meet. Meet Chair Jeremy Sanford has an outstanding event flyer that provides all of the key details. Building on feedback from our past meets, the idea of setting a reduced fee for early registration was discussed.

Advertising will start in Comments and Confab, and we will send information to the other LCOC regions and to key auto magazines that publish show promotions. We will pursue getting Lincoln Division and dealership support for this event in addition to the support we usually get from our classic Lincoln parts and service providers. Helen Hutchinson encouraged Jeremy to ensure that there was something of interest in the "goody bag" for the women who attend the meet. Jeremy will set up a separate bank account for this event and link it to an option for credit card payments. Mike Cunningham volunteered to join Jeremy and John Woodward on the initial meet committee.

2012 Northern and Southern Club Activities are covered elsewhere in this They will begin with the tradiissue. tional new year kick-off dinner February 11 at the Sportsman's Lodge in Studio City. This event will be combined with a Winter Board Meeting. A Spring/ Summer Board Meeting - to be confirmed /tied to a final club event schedule. A Western National Meet Board Meeting will be scheduled during September 26 through 30 Western National Meet. A November Region Board Meeting date and location to be determined.

The plan and economics of the flag project were discussed as part of the Director's update. The shirt project was discussed. The board concluded that \$70 per shirt is too expensive. Marv agreed to work on this further with Carol and Hal. Marv will also check into the current *Comments* policy for advertising club projects.

Biographies for those running for a board seat in 2012 need to be submitted in August. Ballots will be sent out in September. More details regarding the election process will be discussed and finalized at the February board meeting.
