Huntington Beach Concours by John Walcek

The LCOC Western Region Spring Meet was held at the Huntington Beach Concours on June 2. With active promotion by activities chairman Jim Ayres, we managed to field 13 Lincolns from the '40s to the '80s, from stock to customized.

This time of year, the typical southern California coastal "June gloom" (clouds in the morning maybe yielding to sun in the afternoon) did make for a pleasant and enjoyable outdoor event. Cars and motorcycles were parked on hills, under trees, and near the lake.

The day started early for me, as I drove one of Jim Ayres' two cars, his '61 Lincoln Continental sedan, and we started parking cars at 6 a.m.

Jim is so thorough, thinking of every detail in preparation for the day. We hung the Lincoln banner between two trees, set up a table with chairs for the board meeting, had an ice chest full of drinks, and had breakfast snacks and box lunches for board members/helpers.

Stacy Roscoe conducted a nice outdoor board meeting by the lake, with even Tom McCarthy present (who recently sold his emberglow '66 LC convertible to LCOC National Chief Judge John Talbourdet's wife Jeanne. Tom attended from Menifee (near San Diego). Then we picnicked with drinks and box lunches from Subway.

Parked nearby were many nice Bentleys, T Birds and Jaguar's. Other noteworthy cars at the show: a '41 Studebaker (with grills similar to those of pre-war Lincolns), a '47 Triumph Roadster, a '31 Cadillac V16, an unrestored '53 Kaiser Darrin, a '59 Plymouth Convertible, a '74 Olds 442 W30, and many Ford Model T's and Corvettes.

The T Bird people liked Stacy Roscoe's '58 LC best from the Lincolns, and Jack Swing presented him with a plaque. The T Bird club fielded 11 cars, and we liked Bob Rosas' '62 T Bird convertible.

Lincolns included Elliot Jones' customized '46 LC coupe with a modern Lincoln Mark VIII engine and interior, Stacy Roscoe's '58 LC convertible, three Continental Mark IIs owned by Sherman Lovegren, Bruce and Helen Hutchinson, and Norm Hoskins; Jim Ayres' '61 LC sedan and '64 LC convertible, Brian Bernsen's '65 LC convertible, John Ellison's '66 LC convertible, George and Shirley Richard's '71 Mark III, Wayne Warner's '72 Mark IV, Steve Braddon's '75 Mark V, and Robert Supalla's '86 Continental Givenchy.



A Visit to the Day Family Classic Car Museum

With the active involvement of our LCOC regional activities chairman, Jim Ayres, there's always something fun and stimulating to get involved in and benefit from as we expand our Lincoln Continental horizons.

On April13, some 10 of our Lincoln people joined 23 T Bird people to tour the Day Family Classic Car Museum, in Corona, CA. Some of our members drove their old cars, and before going in, we all assembled in front for a nice picture. Lincoln people included Jim Ayres, John Walcek, Arv and Nicole Larson, Norm Stahlberg, Bill Green, Jerry Holub, Jim and Carol Higgs, and Brian Bernsen.

The 33,000 sq. ft. building was built especially for Tom and Diane Day's collection, and has a bar and full commercial kitchen to accommodate party and event functions on the roof or in a courtyard alongside. It now houses \$9,000,000 worth of collectible autos. Then there's a big garage building in the back, which is used for maintenance and storage, where some 20 cars are parked. The museum is only open to groups such as ours, and the \$15 per person donation goes to one of three charities; ours went to Children's Hospital of Orange County.

It's a very personal collection and houses some 140 mainly '50s, '60s, and '70s American cars, and other nostalgic memorabilia, for his wife Diane, their children and grandkids. Ed Janoski, museum manager, gave us a tour and explained the sig-

nificance of the cars and settings. Afterwards, we were free to browse around and take pictures at will.

As we entered, there was a custom all chrome 2010 Audi R8 with changing lights in the wheels and interior, and a classic 1931 Packard V12 Roadster. There were three cars at a re-creation of the Gage drive in theater in Southgate, cars around a

malt shop with arches, and cars along an old town main street, along with period architecture, furnishings, and signs. A TV played old episodes from "The Andy Griffith Show" near their '63 Galaxie squad car. There was Lucille Ball's '84 Rolls Royce Silver Spur Sedan, and Red Skelton's '63 Willys, along with plenty of the stars' memorabilia. There was a '59 red Cadillac convertible, a cream '59 Lincoln Continental convertible, a '65 Mustang retractable hardtop, a '58 Chevy Impala convertible, and many Corvettes, Mustangs, and Cobras. All the cars are used by family members and friends, and often driven to various events throughout southern California.

I always marvel at such a collection, and take note on how the cars are maintained. Mr. Tom Day owns an aerospace testing equipment company, and investment properties. I know I struggle to keep up with my goal of 7 drivable cars!

Afterwards, we had lunch at Miguel's Mexican Restaurant, and had a great time reminiscing memories rekindled by our tour.




