Western Region at the Nethercutt Collection on Saturday, March 29th

or the second time the Western Region visited the fabled Nethercutt Collection in Sylmar on Saturday, March 29. They toured the six story San Sylmar Tower of Beauty: cars, pipe organs and other memorabilia, followed by lunch at the Bear Pit in nearby Mission Hills.

In the '20s, J.B. (Jack) Nethercutt's aunt, Merle Norman founded a small Los Angeles company to provide cosmetics for the movie stars and motion picture industry. J.B. was born in Indiana in 1913. When he was nine his mother died and he came west to live with his aunt. Later, he dropped out of college to enter her business. Then he bought her out and turned it into a \$100 million a year enterprise located in Sylmar.

He was always fascinated with the great classic cars of the '20s and '30s and the magnificent Los Angeles automobile showrooms where they were displayed. In 1956 Jack and his wife Dorothy bought a 1936 Duesenberg JN convertible coupe which the collection still has. At the same time he bought a very rough 1930 DuPont Town Car. It took him 19 months

This 1921 Lincoln L Phaeton was one of the first Lincolns Built. and \$65,000 to restore the DuPont. Later he sold it to Bill Harrah in Reno and bought it back at an auction after Harrah's death. The collection still has the DuPont. These two cars were the beginnings of the Nethercutt Collection. From these roots Jack's interest expanded to include magnificent brass era cars, European classic cars, and he could enter cars in the Pebble Beach Concours d' Elegance.

Restoring these cars at his own facility became a must because Jack Nethercutt was a perfectionist.

As the years went by, the collection expanded to include some of the most historic cars in the world, including a 1907 Westinghouse, legend Rudolph (Continued on Page 4.)

Valentino's 1923 Voisin, Fatty Arbuckle's 1923 McFarlan, Constance Bennett's 1930 Rolls Royce Phantom II Town Car, one of the first Lincolns built in 1921, the 1933 Duesenberg "Twenty Grand", a 1936 Cadillac Aerodynamic Coupe, Mr. Judkins' personal 1938 Lincoln V-12, Cadillacs and Packards by the score, and a bevy of Rolls-Royces, among other spectacular European marques.

Such cars needed housing worthy of their elegance and value. This led to a decision in the early '60s to build a museum on the Merle Norman Cosmetics manufacturing grounds in Sylmar. The first building was the six story San Sylmar Tower of Beauty which also houses the hood ornaments, French antique furniture, rare musial instruments, and restoration shops.


In 2000, a second museum, one story, across the street, was opened to display the overflow of cars. There are now 260 cars in the collection of which 200 are on display. Twice the tower has been hit by earthquakes, in 1971 and 1973, but it has survived both. (Continued on Page 5.)



A 1927 Lincoln L engine under glass. Below, the 1933 Duesenberg "Twenty Grand".



The main floor of the original museum/tower is a recreation of the splendid automobile showrooms of the '20s and '30s with their gigantic marble Greek columns, mirrored walls, marble floors, awesome chandeliers, staircases, and second floor balconies to look down on the cars.

Yes, such buildings did once exist on Figueroa Street in Los Angeles and Van Ness Avenue in San Francisco. One of the most spectacular was for Earle C. Anthony Packard. Another was for Charlie Howard Buick. (Howard also owned the race horse Seabiscuit.) Some of the San Francisco dealerships survive.

J.B. Nethercutt, who died in 2004 at the age of 91, had a passion for beauty in all of its forms. There is even a copy of Louis XV's 16-seat dining room where J.B. entertained his guests on a regular basis. With his car collection already becoming legendary in the '60s, he presented his wife with an antique music box as an anniversary gift, and the music collection was born. It went from disc and cylinder music boxes to player and reproducing pianos, nickelodeons. giant Orchestrions, and one of the largest theater organs ever made.

The latest addition to the Nethercutt Collection is the restored steam locomotive and parlor car. The locomotive is the 1937 Canadian-Pacific Royal Hudson #2839 4-6-4 wheeler pioneered by the New York Central. With this locomotive, King George VI and his wife crossed Canada by train in 1939 and this locomotive attained a top speed of 90 mph.

The Pullman railcar *California* was built for Clara Baldwin Stocker in 1912. She was the eldest daughter of California pioneer "Lucky" Baldwin and she inherited \$10 million. The railcar has one double large bedroom, two smaller bedrooms, a kitchen, a combination dining room and observation room, and an observation platform. Both the locomotive and railcar

were restored by the Nethercutt Collection. Today the collection is managed by J.B.'s son Jack and his wife Helen. He and Helen serve as Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Board of Directors of Merle Norman Cosmetics and Chairmen of the Board of Directors for the Nethercutt Collection. They continue restoring cars and entering them in Concours d'Elegance competition.

Since the beginning the Nethercutt Collection has been open free to the public by reservation only with tours of the tower offered twice daily Thursday through Saturday. On our tour we discovered you can barely see everything in a day. The tour takes two hours and includes only the tower. The on-your-own tour of the building across the street with all the cars takes at least two hours. A tour of the railway car and steam locomotive takes another hour. Organ and piano concerts are offered six times a year.

February 6 Winter Board Meeting by Conference Call

A Winter 2014 Board of Directors Meeting of the Western Region of LCOC was held on the evening of February 6 with seven directors in attendance. This meeting was held as a telephone conference call which lasted for one and a half hours. Conference call board-meetings are now being held more often as they are much easier to attend than regular meetings, business gets done faster, and allows members to attend region events without having their fun interrupted by region business.

The Treasurer's Report listed a balance of \$2,502.77 in the Savings Account and \$3,420 in the Checking Account. Dues will be raised to \$35 a year beginning January 1, 2015. The website was immediately changed to reflect dues at \$35 a year. The higher dues are the result of the 2013 and 2014 budgets which show that the region is currently in a break even position with membership down from previous years and many events showing a loss in profits. Membership currently stands at 185.

Partnership events with other Lincoln clubs were discussed. National has put new judging rules in effect to draw LZOC and LOC members to our National meets. Their members can now enter our meets without joining LCOC and will be regarded as members for the judging day, competing for Primary Awards and trophies up to the level of Lincoln Trophies.

A National update was made by Bruce Hutchinson and Stacy Roscoe regarding the opening of the Lincoln Heritage Motor Car Museum August 9, National Meet changes, changes in judging, the National Website and National Directory.

Reports were made on upcoming National Meets. The Eastern National Meet for 2014 will be held in St. Pete Beach, Florida April 30-May 4. It will be LCOC's first non-judged meet run as a test to see if such a National Meet draws more members. The Western National Meet will take place in Tacoma, Washington July 16-20. The Mid-America National Meet will be held in

Rockford, Illinois September 17-21. It is anticipated that this will be the largest meet of the year with 100 or more cars participating. 2015 National Meets will be held in Concordville, Pennsylvania, Michigan, and San Diego.

The last Western Region Election was held through the *Confab* and it worked out well. We have nine seats on the board with terms expiring for Bruce Hutchinson, Bob Reed and Jeremy Stanford at the end of 2014. There is a vacancy open for Mike Cunningham's seat. Candidates for the Board are asked to have their biographies in to Tom McCarthy by June 30 so they can be published in the August 15 issue of the *Confab*. Winners will be announced at the November Board Meeting.

During the February 6 board meeting, Shirley Richards tendered her resignation as a board member and was replaced by Ron Cressy effective immediately.

Region events for 2014 began with the Kickoff Brunch at the Proud Bird on February 9 and a tour to the Nethercutt Collection on March 29. These events will be followed by Fabulous Fords Forever at Knotts April 27 and the Spring Meet at the Huntington Beach Concours on June 1. Jeremy Sanford is planning a Wine Country Event/Tour. Jim Ayres and Jeremy Sanford are working on additional Northern and Southern Discussion was started regarding an October event in San Diego that would serve as a dry run for a Western National Meet in San Diego in 2015. The goal for this 2015 Meet is 100 cars. Jim Ayrers and Ron Cressy are organizing this meet.

Region Projects were discussed only briefly. The plan is to sell all remaining Car Flags. Space for Business Card size ads is still available in each issue of the *Confab* for the reasonable price of \$50 a year.

The June, 2014 board meeting will be a conference call to allow everyone to enjoy the Huntington Beach Concours. A traditional board meeting will be held in November.

2015 Western National Meet in San Diego

The Lincoln and Continental Owners Club 2015 Western National Meet will be held in San Diego in October 2015, in conjunction with San Diego's year long Centennial Celebration of the 1915 Panama-California Exposition in Balboa Park. Along with San Diego's 100th, the 75th anniversary of the 1940 models, 50th anniversary of the 1965s, and the 25th anniversary of 1990 cars will be honored.

The Western Region of LCOC will be hosting the first National Meet in San Diego in 20 years! We anticipate a very large turnout for this event, with joint participation of several Lincoln and Continental clubs. There will be many events to choose from throughout the week. We will be doing a daylong driving tour on San Diego back country roads. There will be a day in Balboa Park at the Zoo or exploring the many museums and gardens in the Park. There might even be a tour of a private car collection or two!

San Diego has endless places to visit, from California's first Mission, Old Town, The Gaslamp Quarter, Maritime Museums, the Historic Hotel Del Coronado, Point Loma, La Jolla, Torrey Pines State Reserve, Del Mar, Mission Bay, Sea World and the San Diego Zoo.

Plan your 2015 vacation now, and spend the week with us in San Diego in October.

Final dates, along with our host hotel and event schedule will be revealed at the culmination of the 2014 Western National Meet in Tacoma July 17 - 19. Mark your calendars: August 6-9 of 2014 will be the grand opening of the Lincoln Motor Car Heritage Museum on the grounds of the Gilmore Car Museum in Hickory Corners, Michigan.

In addition, the Lincoln and Continental Owners Club is partnering with the Lincoln Owner's Club to organize a series of activities that culminate with the ribbon cutting of the museum building, opening it to the public.
