75th Anniversary of the Lincoln Continental Oct. 11 at Witt Lincoln in San Diego

On Saturday, October 11 the Western Region National Fall Meet was held in San Diego as a warmup to the October, 2015 Western National Meet. The location was Witt Lincoln in San Diego's Mission Valley. The meet had a turnout of 28 cars and two or three times that many members, mostly from all over San Diego County plus a good representation from the Los Angeles area. This turned out to be the largest region event of the year.

The Western Region's celebration of the introduction of the first Lincoln Continental brought out two prewar Lincoln Continentals, one prewar Lincoln-Zephyr, two postwar Lincoln Continentals plus a great variety of Lincolns and Continentals from all years including a beautifully restored red 1957 Lincoln Premiere coupe and a rare 1950 "baby" Lincoln sedan.

The success of this event was due primarily to Jim Ayres and Bob Cressy who made a supreme effort to get out the cars and also to dealership owner Ed Witt who provided a superb location and venue. Witt furnished the food.



2015 Western National Meet, San Diego October 14-18

he 2015 Western National Meet in San Diego on October 14 – 18, 2015, is being billed as the "largest gathering of Lincolns and Continentals on the West Coast," where well over 100 classic Lincolns are expected. The meet is being held at the Town and Country Resort, located on 46 beautifully landscaped acres in Mission Valley, just a few miles north of Balboa Park. For the first time, the Lincoln Owners Club (LOC), Lincoln Zephyr Owners Club (LZOC) and Road Race Lincoln Registry (RRLR), along with several other Lincoln clubs

will be participating in this joint club meet hosted by the LCOC Western Region.

Along with the Centennial of the 1915 Panama-California Exhibition in Balboa Park, the clubs will be celebrating the 75th Anniversary of the 1940 Lincoln Continental, the 50th of the 1965 Continentals, and the 25th of the 1990 Lincoln Town Car, Continental and Mark VII. The official meet poster, designed by club member and artist Steven Erler of Auto-Visuals.com, features the famous California building in Balboa Park and

images of the anniversary Lincolns and Continentals being honored at next year's event.

Plans are well under way for a week full of activities centered around the big concours show on Saturday October 17. Events will extend beyond the traditional 4-day format, to allow members the opportunity to spend a week vacation enjoying all that San Diego has to offer, including Old Town, Little Italy, The Gaslamp Quarter, Mission Bay and Seaport Village. The famous San Diego Red Trolley light rail line stops directly in back of the hotel, offering guests easy transportation throughout the area, including to the Mexican border to visit Tijuana – bring your passports!

A long distance driving tour to Ramona over the rural back country roads of San Diego County is planned, along with local tours of some private San Diego car collections and private museums. We will also be devoting a day in Balboa Park to visit the 14 museums located there, and marvel at the beautiful Spanish-Colonial Revival architecture that inspired development in California throughout the 1920s and '30s.

Save the date for a grand time in San Diego! The official meet days are Wednesday October 14 through Sunday October 18, 2015. An extended vacation is recommended to allow time to see everything that San Diego has to offer. Call the Town and Country Resort today at 800-772-8527 to secure your reservation. Ask for the special \$119 Lincoln rate, valid from Sunday October 11 through Wednesday October 21. Come a few days early or stay a few days longer – you are going to have a great vacation in San Diego!

We have not had a National Meet in San Diego since 1995, and we have not had a National Meet at the Town and Country Resort in San Diego's Mission Valley since 1959. The year 2015 promises to be the greatest San Diego meet of all!




Jeremy Sanford reported that our membership is currently at 185 with five new members in the past six months. We have about 60 national members in the area that are not in the Western Region.


