From the bold, creative use of chrome to the space age dashboards, the striking Imperials certainly are cars you can walk around a few times and always find something you missed. The Imperial Club car owners were very proud to show off their fine vehicles and made sure the guest cars and their owners were well taken care of.

There were several Cadillacs, mostly rare El Dorados from the '50s, two beautiful Packards, '65 and '67 Thunderbirds, an original Toronado and a Riviera, too. You really could stand back and compare the personal luxury competition from the mid 1960s; these were the styling and technological pinnacles from Ford, GM, and Chrysler of the era.

This was also a great gathering of Lincoln Marks, with one each of a Mark II, '71 Mark III, '74 Mark IV, '79 Mark V, and '83 Mark VI; with a hot rod '89 Town Car, plus two stunning new Lincolns (MKZ and MKC) at the entrance. Two Mercurys, a couple of Camaros, an original Cobra, and even a Corvair convertible made appearances.

A real attention getter was the display of four Dodges from the late '50s - early '60s, complete with period literature, accessories, and even a station wagon with luggage strapped to the roof rack. A lot of effort and pride went into showing these rare Dodges. It brought back memories hearing names like: Southhampton, Seneca, Phoenix, Polara, Crown Coupe, Cordoba, Town and Country (with real wood), LeBaron, and I even saw a "Spectator" which was the chrome nameplate put on Dodge station wagons that had the rear-facing third seat.

The entrance fee was $\$ 15$ which included an all day help yourself buffet topped off with a burger and chicken outdoor grill -by the pool, of course!. # 2015 <br> Western National Meet. San Diego Dctober 14-18 

Sixty years ago in 1955 the romantic comedy-drama film PICNIC debuted in theaters, winning two Academy Awards for Best Art Direction and Best Film Editing. Starring William Holden and Kim Novak, PICNIC received six Academy nominations including best picture, and offered a full supporting cast that included Betty Field, Susan Strasberg, Cliff Robertson, Arthur O'Connell, Reta Shaw and Rosalind Russell. Based on the play of the same name by William Inge, the film dramatizes 24 hours in the life of a rural mid-west town and its annual Labor Day picnic.

Also nominated for Best Music, Scoring of a Dramatic or Comedy Picture, the "Theme From Picnic" composed by George Duning was a hit song reaching number one on the 1956 Billboard charts, and number 14 overall that year. The song is featured in the famous dance scene between Holden and Novak.

We'll have more than 24 hours at our picnic this year - the 2015 Western National Meet is being held October 14-18 at the Town and Country

Resort, located on 46 beautifully landscaped acres in San Diego's Mission Valley, just a few miles north of Balboa Park. Along with the Centennial of the 1915 Panama-California Exhibition in Balboa Park, we will be celebrating the 75th anniversary of the 1940 Lincoln Continental, the 50th of the 1965 Continental, and the 25th of the 1990 Lincoln Town Car, Continental and Mark VII. The official meet poster, designed by club member and artist Steven Erler of Auto-Visuals.com, features the famous California building in Balboa Park and images of the anniversary Lincolns and Continentals being honored at next years' event. The restored tower of the California building has reopened for the first time since the 1930's, with a spectacular 360 degree view.

More stars will be showing up in San Diego in October, including the Continental Mark II, also making its debut in 1955. Expect to see more Lincoln and Continental stars than you've ever seen in one place on the West Coast before! Plans are well under way for a week full of activities
centered around the big concours show on Saturday October 17. Events will extend beyond the traditional 4day format, to allow members the opportunity to spend a week vacation enjoying all that San Diego has to offer, including Old Town, Little Italy, The Gaslamp Quarter, Mission Bay and Seaport Village. The famous San Diego Red Trolley light rail line stops directly in back of the hotel, offering guests easy transportation throughout the area, including to the Mexican border to visit Tijuana - bring your passports!

A long distance driving tour to Ramona over the rural back country roads of San Diego County is planned, along with local tours of private San Diego car collections. We will also be devoting a day in Balboa Park to visit the many museums located there, and marvel at the beautiful SpanishColonial Revival architecture that inspired development in California throughout the 1920's and 30's.

Save the date for a grand time in San Diego! The official meet days are Wednesday October 14 through Sunday October 18, 2015. An extended vacation is recommended to allow time to see everything that San Diego has to offer. Go to LCOC.org/Meets.asp and click on the Hotel online reservation link, or call the Town and Country Resort today at 800-772-8527 to secure your reservation. Ask for the special $\$ 119$ Lincoln rate, valid from Sunday October 11 through Wednesday October 21. Come a few days early or stay a few days longer - you're going to have a PICNIC in San Diego!
