

The United States Navy has had a continued presence in San Diego since 1904, and today maintains the second largest naval base in the nation. Home to the Pacific Fleet for over 100 years, San Diego has a storied history in the defense of our nation. In 1952, the Navy created the Miramar Naval Air Station, and in 1962 Coronado Island became the west coast Naval Amphibious Base and home of the Navy SEALS. The aircraft carrier USS Midway, first commissioned in 1945, began its role as a floating museum here in 2004, attracting visitors from around the world.

Henry Fonda served in the Navy during World War II, and earned a Presidential Unit Citation Award and Bronze Star for "Heroic or Meritorious Achievement." The Oscar winning actor portrayed many famous roles in his nearly 50-year acting career, including Admiral Chester Nimitz in the 1976 movie *Midway*, and his infamous title role in the 1955 film *Mister Roberts*, co-starring Jack Lemmon, James Cagney and William Powell.

Now it is your turn to star in San Diego, with Lincoln and Continental motorcars landing in greater numbers this October than ever seen before!


The 2015 Western National Meet is being held October 14 – 18 at the Town and Country Resort, located on 46 beautifully landscaped acres in San Diego's Mission Valley, just a few miles north of Balboa Park. Along with the Centennial of the 1915 Panama-California Exposition in Balboa Park, we will be celebrating the 75th anniversary of the 1940 Lincoln Continental, the 50th of the 1965 Continental, and the 25th of the 1990 Lincoln Town Car, Continental and Mark VII. The official meet poster, designed by club member and artist Steven Erler of Auto-Visuals.com, features the famous California building in Balboa Park and images of the anniversary Lincolns and Continentals being honored at next year's event. The restored tower of the California building has reopened to the public for the first time since the 1930's, with a spectacular 360 degree view of the area.

More stars will be showing up in San Diego in October, including the Continental Mark II, celebrating the 60th anniversary of its debut. Plans are well under way for a week full of activities centered around the big concours show on Saturday October 17. Events will extend beyond the traditional 4-day format, to allow attendees the opportunity to spend a week vacation enjoying all that San Diego has to offer, including the San Diego Zoo, Old Town, Little Italy, The Gaslamp Quarter, Mission Bay and Seaport Village. The famous San Diego Red Trolley light rail line stops directly in back of the hotel, offering guests easy transportation throughout the area, including to the Mexican border to visit Tijuana - bring your passports!

A long distance driving tour to Ramona over the rural back country roads of San Diego County is planned, along with local tours of private San Diego car collections. We will also be spending a day in Balboa Park to visit the many museums located there, and marvel at the beautiful Spanish-Colonial Revival architecture that inspired development in California throughout the 1920's and 30's.

Save the date for a grand time in San Diego! The official meet days are Wednesday October 14 through Sunday October 18, 2015. An extended vacation is recommended to allow time to see everything that San Diego has to offer. Go to LCOC.org/Meets.asp and click on the Hotel online reservation link, or call the Town and Country Resort today at 800-772-8527 to secure your reservation. Ask for the special \$119 Lincoln rate, valid from Sunday October 11 through Wednesday October 21. Come a few days early or stay a few days longer – you'll be glad you landed in San Diego!

### Latest Update on the 2015 San Diego Western National Meet

The biggest and most event packed Western National Meet in LCOC history is shaping up to be all that its meet committee has been planning for the past year!

Registration at the San Diego Town and Country Resort/Hotel in Mission Valley will begin on Wednesday, October 14, with tours of local car collections including the San Diego Automotive Museum in Balboa Park and lunch at the Calumet Collection.

Thursday there will be an 80 mile driving tour on North San Diego County backgrounds. Member cars will drive on well paved secondary roads from the hotel to Ramona where we will view an impressive collection of beautifully restored Cadillacs, Chryslers, Buicks and Lincolns owned by LCOC member Larry Knoepp. From there we will have lunch at the nearby Ramona Valley Grill which serves steaks, hamburgers and sandwiches at very reasonable prices and has a huge paved parking lot.

After lunch we will proceed down into the beautiful San Pasqual Valley which in 1846 was the site of the bloodiest battle of the Mexican-American War.

Briefly, in the early 1840s California broke away from Mexico and became an independent country, but not for long. After a series of fierce although obscure battles such as San Pasqual, California became a territory of the United States.

We will stop at the San Pasqual Battlefield California State Park/Museum where we will learn where and how the U.S. Army under the command of Brigadier General Stephen W. Kearney paid a dear price to make California a part of Manifest Destiny and the growing Union.

From there the cars will drive on to Escondido and return to the hotel via Interstate 15. This is one driving tour you will not want to miss.

Thursday evening there will be a Sunset Cocktail Cruise on Mission Bay.

Friday will be a day in Balboa Park visiting the museums. Saturday will be the day of the big show with over 100 cars anticipated. Sunday there will be an optional lunch at the Hotel Del Coronado.

This will be a meet to rival last year's grand opening of the Lincoln Motor Car Heritage Museum in the burgeoning metropolis of Hickory Corners, Michigan. Don't miss a day of it! Get your meet and hotel reservations in now!
