The Drive Is On - to San Diego this October 2015 Western National Meet, San Diego California October 14-18

ur continuing series of Lincolns and stars features Susan Hayward, the glamorous and feisty red head, well known for her dramatic roles portraying many characters not readily discussed in the 40s and 50s. Ms. Hayward was the first actress to play a female alcoholic in the 1947 film, "Smash-Up, the Story of a Woman" and received an Academy Award nomination for her performance. Over the next decade, she portrayed other driven, and somewhat challenged characters in four additional dramatic films, and received Academy Award nominations for each. Susan Hayward ultimately won an Oscar for her courageous and gritty performance in the 1958 release "I Want to Live!" - the story of death row inmate Barbara Graham. In a career spanning over 35 years, she performed in theatre, film and television until the final curtain call in 1975.

Another star in its own right is San Diego's iconic El Cortez Hotel. Opening in 1927, it was touted by its owner as "The finest hotel on the West Coast", playing a dramatic and innovative roll in San Diego history. Located on the highest point in

downtown, it was a landmark known for glamorous guests, the Starlight Room with 360 degree views of the city, the first exterior glass elevator, and the first moving sidewalk or Travolator in the world. Closed as a hotel in 1978, El Cortez was restored and remodeled, transforming into one of San Diego's most prestigious private residences.

This is a very special year for San Diego, celebrating the centennial of its starring role in the 1915 Panama-California Exposition held in Balboa Park. And it is a very special year for Lincoln Motor Company with the 75th anniversary of the 1940 Lincoln Continental and the debut of Lincoln's new star, the first big new Continental in over a decade. The 2015 Western National Meet is being held October 14 - 18 in San Diego at the Town and Country Resort, located just a few miles north of Balboa Park. The meet will also be featuring the 50th anniversary of the 1965 Continental and the 25th of the 1990 Lincoln models - Lincolns best sales year ever - with special awards for these years. The official meet poster features the anniversary Lincolns and Continentals,

along with the famous California building in Balboa Park. This month's featured image of what might have been – a 1948 Continental sedan - will be one of many available for sale at the meet by artist Steven Erler of Auto-Visuals.com, along with signed and number original prints of the meet poster and a commemorative set of note cards designed for our meet.

There will be a week full of activities before the big concours show on Saturday October 17. Events will extend beyond the traditional 4-day format, to allow attendees an opportunity to spend the week enjoying San Diego attractions like the San Diego Zoo, Old Town, Little Italy, Gaslamp Quarter, Mission Bay and Seaport Village. The famous San Diego Red Trolley light rail line stops directly in back of the hotel, affording guests easy transportation throughout the area.

A long distance driving tour to Ramona over the rural back country roads of San Diego County is planned, along with local tours of private San Diego car collections. A self-guided tour of the Midway will be offered, and a luxurious Mission Bay dinner cruise will be the highlight of events on Thursday evening. Not to be missed Friday morning will be the Grand Caravan Parade of Lincolns into Balboa Park. We will visit the many museums located there and marvel at the beautiful Spanish-Colonial Revival architecture that inspired development in California throughout the 1920s and 1930s..

The official meet days are Wednesday October 14 through Sunday October 18, 2015. Attendees should plan on arriving Tuesday to be ready for all the activities starting Wednesday AM. Many events will have limited availability, so register early! Go to LCOC.org/Meets.asp and click on the Hotel online reservation link, or call the Town and Country Resort today at 800-772-8527 to secure your reservation. Our special \$119 Lincoln rate is valid from Sunday October 11 through Wednesday October 21, so stay until Monday to catch all of the Sunday events planned. Come a few days early or stay a few days longer there is so much to see and do - you won't want to miss anything! Bob Blevins' 1977 Lincoln Town Coupe with Fixed Glass Moon Roof

Bob Blevins, Yuma, Arizona owns a most unusual 1977 Town Coupe. The car is cordovan and white with a cordovan vinyl roof and a cordovan and white interior with leather seats. The cordovan and white is a very rare color combination, coming in the Town Coupe for this one year and only with leather seats. All the other Town Coupes were one color. They only built 258 with this color combination.

This was the last year with full gauges and the thermometer speedometer because the more modern temperature controls wouldn't fit in this instrument panel.

Blevins bought the car in Gallup, New Mexico three years ago from the second owner who bought the car in 1982 and kept it for 30 years. The car presently has 94,000 miles.

The most unique feature on this car is the fixed glass moon roof. Out of about 27,440 Town Coupes built that year 1,347 had the fixed glass moon roof which is very much like the 1954-56 Mercury Sun Valley except this roof is reflective one way tinted glass, appearing to be a silver color on the outside, but looks merely tinted from the inside. The roof cost \$954, slightly more than the movable moon roof which was smaller. This roof covers the entire forward portion of the front compartment and has a stainless steel border around its edge. It was available with a full vinyl roof, coach roof or painted non-vinyl roof. The fixed glass moon roof option was only available from 1977 through 1979 on both the two-door Town Coupe and four-door Town Car. Lincolns with this option were shipped from Ford to American Sunroof Corporation where the glass roof was installed. A manually operated sliding sunscreen was added to entirely block out the sun. At first the cost was only a few dollars more than the smaller power moon roof, but it kept going up during the three years of production.

The full price of the car was \$13,0711.

Tribute to Randy Mytar, June 8, 1947-March 23, 2015.

On March 23 LCOC and the Western Region lost one of its dearest members when Randy Mytar, age 67, Sherman Oaks, California lost a two year battle with brain cancer. Randy is survived by his wife Carol, two grown children, a son Jason and a daughter Guy, and Randy's mother, Maxine.

Randy was born June 8, 1947 in Santa Monica, California, grew up in Culver City and graduated from Art Center College. He did architectural renderings, and taught at the Art Center in Pasadena from 1971 to 1989. Then he started his own business in architectural painting, working out of his home. Most of his work was in water colors. Randy collected cars, built and flew model airplanes, and played percussion for his own band, the J.L Randall Trio, even playing local bars and restaurants for the love of it. He loved motorized model airplanes since childhood and won many awards with them in competition.

Most of all, Randy loved cars, especially Lincolns. He owned a 1964 Lincoln Continental convertible and a 1953 Lincoln Capri coupe. He also owned a 1955 Studebaker Golden Hawk and a 1957 Buick Caballero station wagon, plus many other cars. He painted water colors of Lincolns for the LCOC directory and website. He even painted a proposed rendering for the Lincoln Motor Car Heritage Museum which although brilliant was never accepted for the final design. He was



the comedian auctioneer at LCOC Western National Meets for years. He always attended National our Meets dressed outrageously, like in 1920s golf attire or as a Hollywood cowboy.

The last LCOC National Meet where he participated was the 2012 Western National Meet in Concord, California as shown in these photos. The last National Meet he attended was the Western National Meet in Phoenix in 2013.

Randy stood out like a peacock in a park full of pigeons, had a gift of humor to rival Jay Leno, and was generous to an extreme. Randy was the type of guy who would give you the shirt off his back and the checkered coat to go with it. In his success, he would always share his wealth, whether it be to help a friend in need, or stranger on the street. He loved spending days flying model airplanes at a local flying field, and watching classic old movies because he liked beauty in many forms. He was a very positive person who found silver linings wherever he went. He was an institution in LCOC, loving everybody and always leaving us laughing. He will be missed by all of us, but at least we have his kindness, generosity and good humor to carry on without him.
