# 2015 Mid-America National Meet

They said it couldn't be done - 100 cars at a LCOC National Meet - considering attendance at all three National Meets in recent years. Well, 104 cars were registered for the 2015 Mid-America National Meet in Hickory Corners, Michigan August 5-9 and approximately 94 showed! It was billed as a "Lincoln Homecoming, Celebrating the Diamond Jubilee of the Lincoln Continental." While the Michigan weather was mostly overcast every day, heavy rains held off until the Monday after the event. Sponsor of the Mid-America was LCOC National with members of the Michigan and Northstar Regions really pitching in to bring it all together. Special kudos go Dennis Garrett, Director of the Michigan Region and Bob Johnson, Director of the Northstar Region.

The host hotel was the new Four Points Sheraton, at the east end of Kalamazoo, which went out of their way to accommodate our crowd of nearly 200 LCOC members, families and friends. This hotel is approximately 15 miles of scenic country roads from Hickory Corners and the Gilmore Museum, site of the Saturday concours.

By the time you get this, our Western National Meet in San Diego will be only weeks away. It is taking place from October 14 through the 18th at the Town and Country Resort Hotel. When we think about dates and the hotel there is one date that you must remember....September 23rd. This is the date after which the LCOC special rate of \$119 per night will no longer be available. However, there is another number of great importance, and that is the 300 "room nights" that earn the club significant benefits and savings. The good news is that we need only 32 more meet participants to sign up for the 4 nights each during the week of the meet. The bad news is that once we get to this level we can't guarantee that the hotel has more rooms available at our special rate or any rate. To protect against finding the hotel sold out, I encourage you to make your reservations immediately. Don't get caught having to stay down the street because you signed up too late!

The same thinking goes for some of our meet events. While we have tried to make sure that we have room for everyone who wants to participate in all of our events, I encourage you to register now so that we can plan for the actual participants who want to attend. Another date of great importance for your car is September 27th. This is the last date to register cars for judging. 



There will be a week full of activities before the big concours show on Saturday October 17, including a driving tour to Ramona, and a luxurious Mission Bay dinner cruise on Thursday evening. Not to be missed Friday morning will be the Grand Caravan Parade of Lincolns into Balboa Park, crossing the picturesque Cabrillo Bridge and entering through the famous California Arch into the Plaza de Panama.


