More on the 2015 San Diego Western National Meet

By all accounts the October 14-18, 2015 Western National Meet in San Diego was a major success. In addition to a huge variety of cars, there were more events to choose from, more places to go, and more things to do than we have experienced in recent times.

We hosted 91 club members, 21 members of other Lincoln clubs, and 70 guests and sponsors for a total of 182 registered participants. A record breaking number of hotel room nights

booked earned benefits for the meet such as free continental breakfast, free hospitality rooms, reduced room rates, and over \$2000 to help cover meet expenses.

The Friday night Buffet and Auction were attended by 108 people, and the Saturday night Gala Awards Banquet attracted over 145 club members and guests. The Saturday night guests walked away with an exciting understanding of the future for the Lincoln Motor Car Company thanks to an outstanding update on the business over the next few years by Lincoln Executive Robert Louisell.

Visiting "Only Yesterday."

One of the five auto collections we visited on our museum tour on Wednesday, October 14 was "Only Yesterday" in Sorrento Valley. This is a very private collection of classic automobiles and is not open to the public. It has an incredible assortment of rare and exotic cars including rare

Rommel and Normandy Invasion artifacts such as a letter by General Eisenhower to President Roosevelt apologizing in the event the invasion failed.

This auto collection seems to be focused on investment. The owner and his tour guide spoke at great length on how they make their car profit selling at the big time auctions, but they Shelbys and other muscle cars.

There is a 1935 Lincoln K roadster that has only 10,000 miles and is body #1 from the custom builder. There is also a section of the museum dedicated to military veterans. Among many World War II artifacts, are letters to and from German General

Gents and Carol: We just returned from a wonderful meet in San Diego even if the weather was not typical, as it was very humid! There was only slight drizzle one morning but that certainly did not dampen the spirits of the attendees. The Western Region outdid themselves with great events and a convenient location with a great show field that was adjacent to the hotel rooms and the Hospitality suite. There were many tours both long and short that allowed the members to pick options that suited their needs which included some stunning private automobile collections. The harbor cruise (which we did not attend) was a hit with the people who enjoyed the views from the harbor and the food.

The show field was one of the best I have seen in a long time, actually rivaling the display at the Museum dedication with at least 7 greyhounds representing the Ls and Ks in the first row. This was followed by many Zephyrs and Continentals, several Mark IIs and another long line of the 58-60 land yachts continuing on to the slab sides with 10 competing for a Lincoln Trophy! The modern Lincolns up to a 2006 LS rounded out the field.

Harold offered the nicest compliment to the LCOC and particularly the Western Region by thanking the LCOC for extending the invitation to the LZOC and other clubs to participate in this event and share a common passion. This was a moving tribute to the goal of fostering relations with all Lincoln clubs and received a warm round of applause.

I believe this is that start of something that will benefit all Lincoln clubs as we move towards the future. This type of unification was the highlight of the meet for me as it represents many years of laying the ground work starting in earnest with Glenn Kramer's meeting in Charlotte, North Carolina.
