

The 2016 31st Fabulous Fords Forever Show at Knott's Berry Farm in Anaheim was another sellout with 1,800 Ford built cars of all description in attendance. There were 57 classes including Lincolns and Continentals. Mustangs made up the largest class with over 1,000 cars.

Director's message

I was able to attend the 26th annual Lincoln-Zephyr Owners Club (LZOC) West Chapter "Gathering of the Faithful" in San Diego. LCOC members received an invitation to this National Meet from Chapter President Harold Norton. Harold and close to a dozen other LZOC members and guests joined us at our October



Western National Meet in San Diego. Since then, he and I have continued to work on ways to build a stronger connection between our two clubs. I was joined by eight other LCOC members at this year's LZOC meet as part of this effort to get members to know each other better and to enjoy the common interests that we all have in the name of Lincoln.

I was asked to address the gathering at the Saturday night awards banquet to talk about how our clubs can continue to work together. One of the themes of my remarks was how common interest and partnership might be found beyond joint attendance at meets. The Lincoln Motor Car Foundation that opened the new Lincoln Museum in Hickory Corners, Michigan in 2014 has proven to be a source of partnership among the various Lincoln clubs over the last few years as we have gotten together for the Foundation programs. Beyond common events, the Foundation could be in a position to provide an opportunity for shared support that could save time and money for each of the individual clubs. In the future, it may be possible to utilize the Foundation as an umbrella organization that could provide such common services as insurance, website support, and maybe even "back office" support, such as membership and billing management, to all the participating Lincoln clubs. As membership numbers shrink and income goes down in all of our clubs, there may be a strong case for individual clubs coming together to share fixed costs that can be more efficiently handled by a common supplier. This type of arrangement keeps organizational independence while at the same time improving the strength of the individual clubs.

For background, here are some key pieces of information regarding LZOC. A national club was formed in New England in 1968, and membership grew to over 900 world-wide members. In 1989 the West Regional Chapter was the first of two chapters established. According to its website, "LZOC encourages the preservation and restoration of the Lincoln Automobiles based on the 1936-1948 J-Series V-12 chassis. These include Lincoln-Zephyrs of 1936-1942, Lincoln V-12's of 1946-1948, Lincoln Customs of 1941-1942, and Lincoln Continentals of 1940-1948." The club publishes a bi-monthly magazine, *The Way of the Zephyr*, and has a national meet each year in the West, Central, and Eastern parts of the country.

The LCOC members in attendance had a wonderful time participating in this year's big LZOC event, and I ask all of you to consider more partnership with the other Lincoln clubs that share our love for the Lincoln brand.

What to Expect

September was chosen for a number of reasons, one being the weather. Daily highs run in the mid-70's and overnight lows in the mid-50's, with minimal probability of any kind of precipitation. The aspen leaves will be starting to turn in the high country, as Mother Nature begins putting on her annual gold-splashed spectacle.



Bear in mind that you will be a mile or more above sea level, and the sun's rays are quite intense, making it easy to get a burn in a short period of time. Plan on using lots of sunscreen, and consider bringing along a broad brimmed hat. Also, be aware that, even on a sunny day,

The Tour

We plan on leaving the host hotel at around 8:00 A.M. on Thursday for a guided caravan up one of the canyons that lead to our destination. As we approach Estes Park, we will pause at a pullout to regroup. Expect to be stared at.

Once we have all arrived and are parked, it will be time for the guided tours, and lunch. You will have a choice of two guided tours...one of the hotel itself, and the other a motorized trolley excursion of the town and surrounding area. Each tour will take about 1-1/2 hours, so you will have time for both, in whichever order you choose.


For our buffet, we have reserved .'The Music Room' which has large picture windows that look out over the town and the Rocky Mountain National Park.


